## QUICK SUMMARY OF COMPETITIONS for new members

With the exception of the Men's Singles and the Ladies Singles all competitions are mixed. Teams in pairs and triples are drawn and this may result in a team of one gender. Full competition rules are displayed in the clubhouse and below is an outline.

Men's Championship Singles	21 shots – 4 bowls
Ladies Championship Singles	21 shots – 4 bowls
Mixed Championship Singles	Played as 2 sets of 7 ends (final played to 9 ends) with a 3 end decider (one shot an end). 4 bowls.
Pairs	15 ends – 4 bowls. Knock out format. Quarter & semi-finals played on one day. Final 18 ends.
Two Wood singles	21 ends – 2 bowls
Handicap singles	The difference between the players handicaps is calculated. The player with the lowest handicap needs to score 21 and the player with the highest handicap needs to score 21 plus the difference in the handicaps. 4 bowls
Jock Simmons	Open to anyone who has not won a singles competition at the club. Played over 3 sets – 1 <sup>st</sup> player to reach 7 shots wins the set. 4 bowls
100 Up	Singles – 4 bowls. Nearest bowl to jack counts 4, next 3, next 2, next 1. 1 <sup>st</sup> to reach 100 shots wins.
Ted Gorman	Players divided into 4 groups. Each group has a round robin to determine the winner of the group (each game is 5 ends). Winners of each group go forward to semi-finals/finals. Played on one day. Everyone brings something for the shared lunch which is usually excellent. 4 bowls.
Tuesday Evening League	Check in by 5.45pm for a 6pm start. Especially good for new bowlers and members. Scoring is 3,2,1 and a tally is kept through the season.
Triples	Played off on one day on a round robin basis. Eight ends per round. Three bowls.
Fixed Jack	Played up to semi-finals on one day. Knock out format. 12 ends score 4,3,2,1. One direction the jack is minimum length and the opposite direction the jack is set at maximum length.
